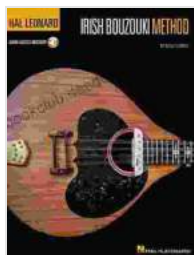

THE IRISH BOUZOUKI

Rested to the family of instruments descending from the ancient Mesopotamian *sandur*, the Irish bouzouki is a recent hybrid resulting from the introduction of the double-necked Greek bouzouki into Irish traditional music in the 1920s. Early Irish bouzouki pioneers include Johnny Moynihan (Sweeney's Men), Pádraig Mac Píobaire (The Chieftains), Donal Lunny (Planxty, The Bothy Band), and Alec Finn (De Dannan). All four experimented with the double-necked bouzouki before acquiring the single-necked bouzouki (with the exception of Alec Finn, who still plays a double-necked). Used almost exclusively for playing dance tunes and songs, the Irish bouzouki quickly caught on and today it is embraced in traditional music-making in Ireland as well as in Irish music-playing communities throughout the globe. As for whether it is truly Irish, only time will tell.

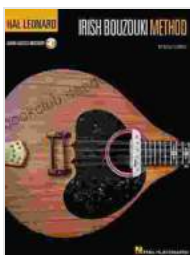

The finest Irish bouzouki is obtained directly from the people who build them, but there are several independent online music vendors available from whom to purchase.

BEFORE YOU PURCHASE

Always ask your vendor how an instrument differs from buying this book. It is a really good idea to get your hands on one to try out before you purchase, preferably in the company of someone else who plays. Attending a music festival or camp can also expose one to a variety of instruments. An internet search for "Irish Festival" should yield a plethora of choices during the summer festival season.

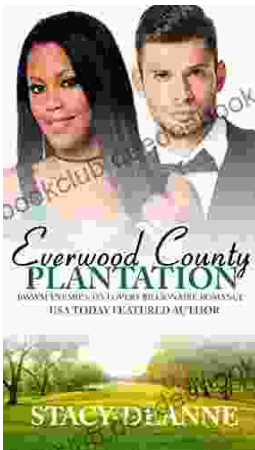
