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1. Embroidered Lace Collar



Materials:

4. Victorian Lace Trimmed Hat



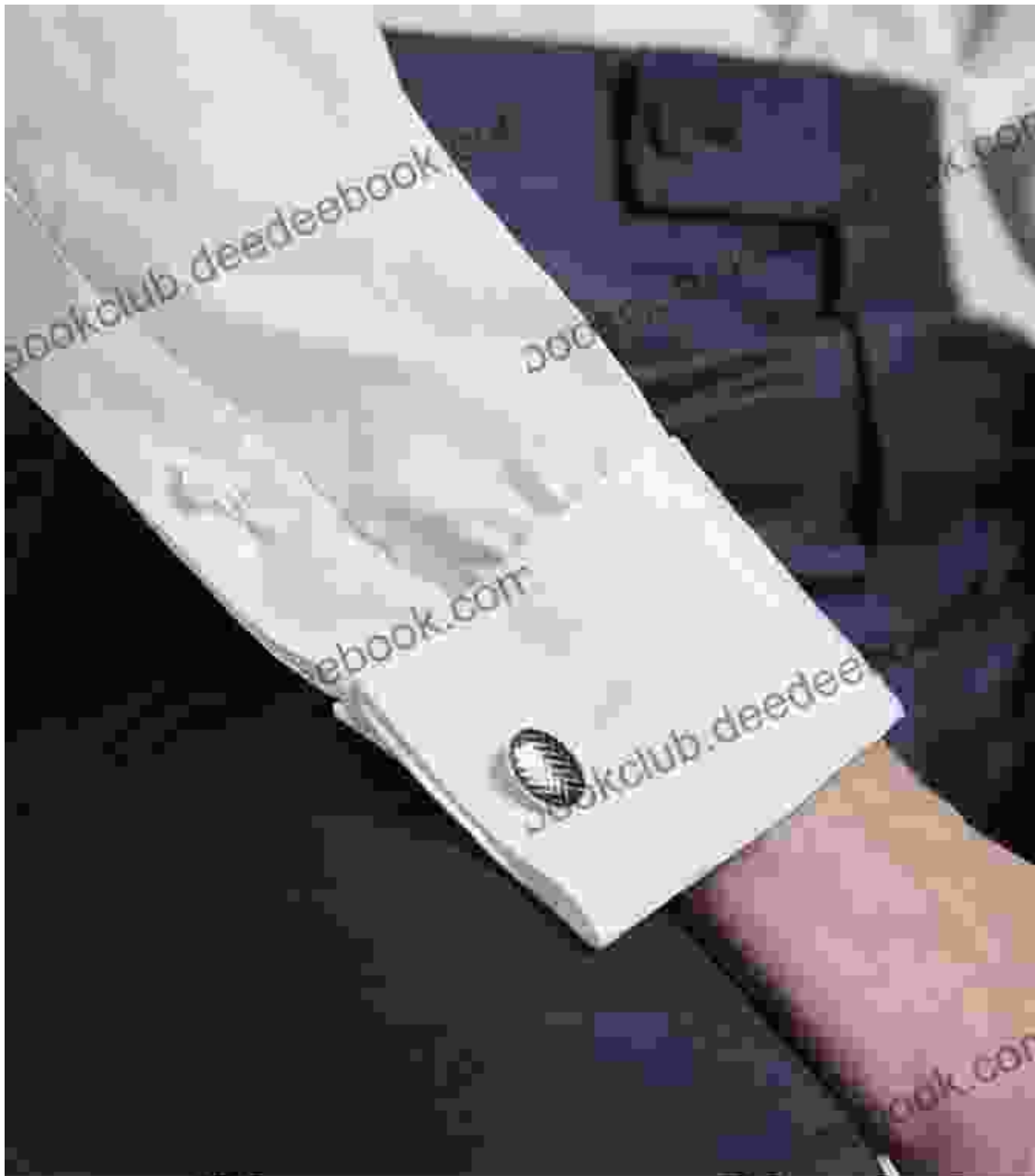
Materials:

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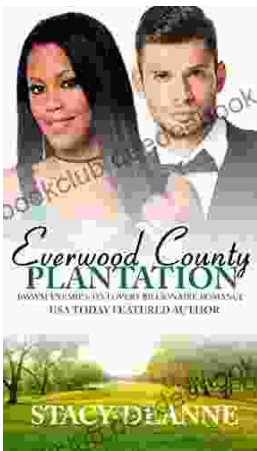
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
