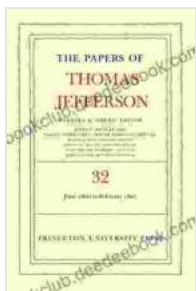


The Papers of Thomas Jefferson, Volume 32: March 1-15, 1806

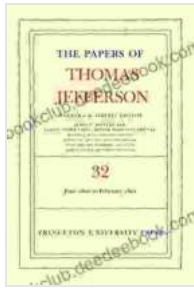
