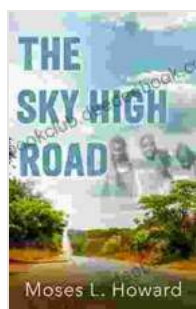

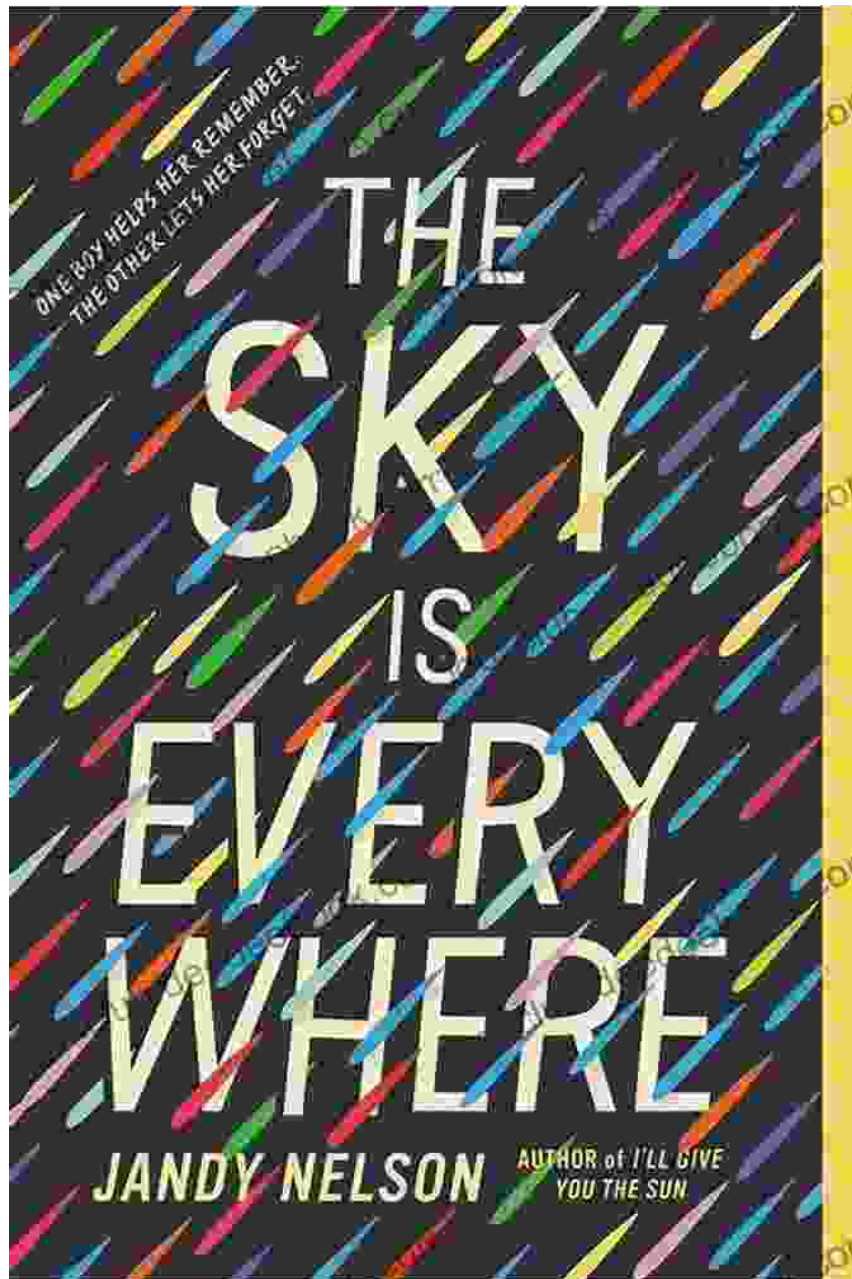

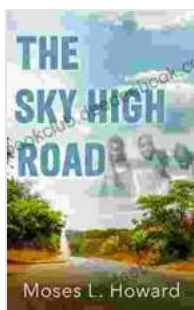
Legacy

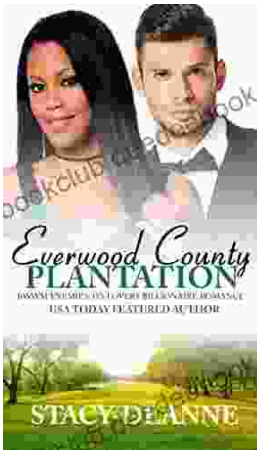
