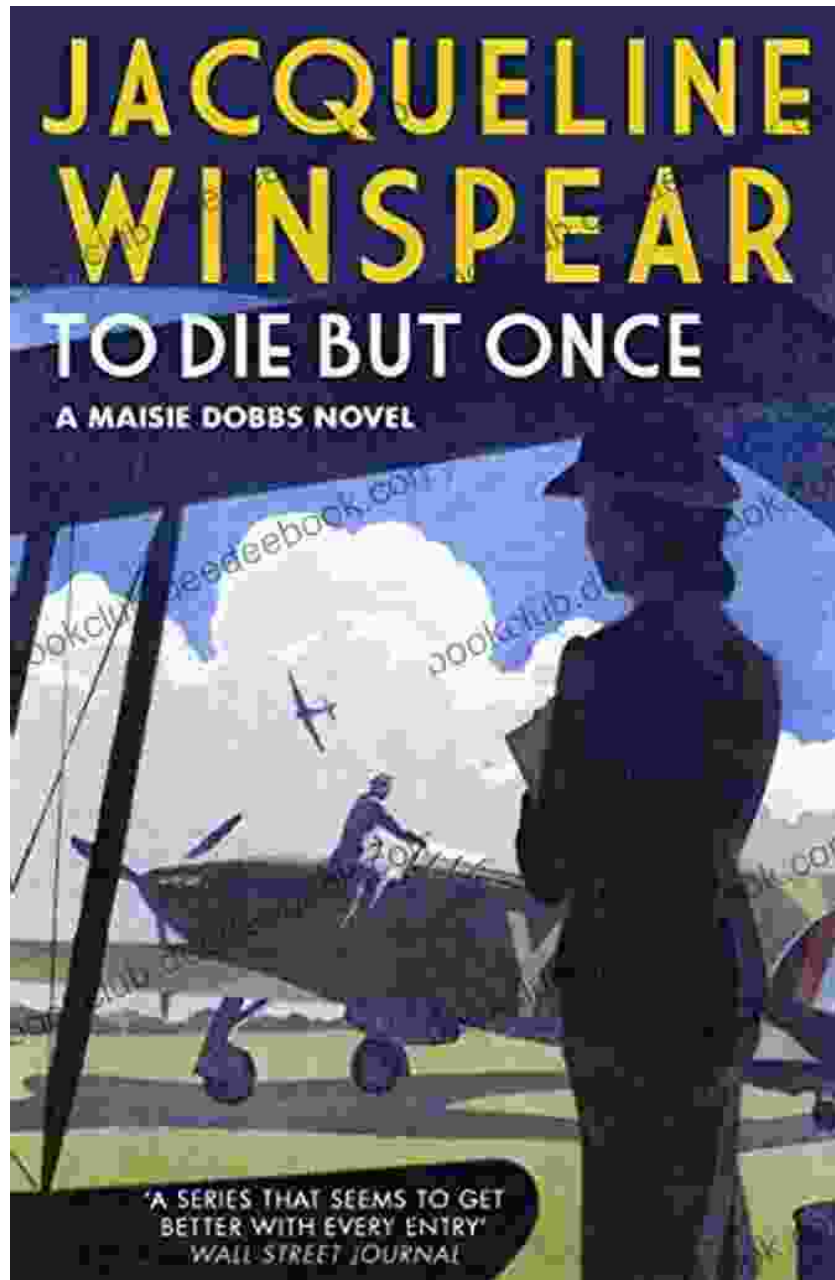

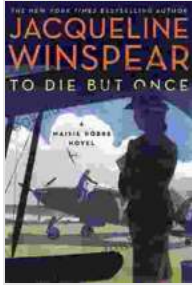

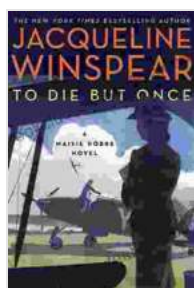
Winspear was born in England and now lives in California. She is a graduate of the University of California, Berkeley, and has a master's degree in English from San Francisco State University.

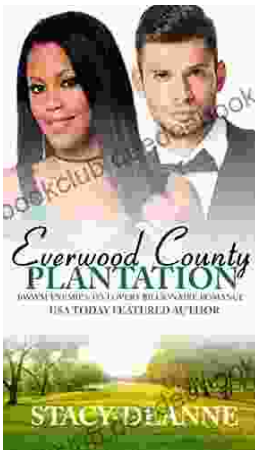
